<b>¼d</b>	Drop letter, inland [for delivery from office of posting], per oz Postcard, inland Parcel, inland, per oz Books/papers, inland
<b>½d</b>	Letter, inland [for delivery from another office of the Dependency], per oz (Books/papers, abroad, per oz, minimum rate: 1d)
<b>1d</b>	Books/papers, abroad, minimum rate: 1d
<b>1½d</b>	Postcard, abroad (Letter, foreign except USA & her possessions, per subsequent oz)
<b>2d</b>	Letter, empire including Egypt, per oz (Registration fee, charged per oz)
<b>2½d</b>	Letter, USA & her possessions, per oz (Advice of delivery fee)
<b>3d</b>	Letter, foreign except USA & her possessions, 1st oz
<b>6d</b>	Parcel, abroad except Canada & UK, per lb
<b>10d</b>	Parcel, Canada, per lb
<b>1/-</b>	Parcel, UK, up to 3 lb
<b>2/-</b>	Parcel, UK, 3 to 7 lb
<b>3/-</b>	Parcel, UK, 7 to 11 lb
<b>6/-</b>	Parcel, UK, 11 to 22 lb
